FACT SHEET Facts and Figures

Personnel

- 94 U.S. marshals [one for each federal court district]
- 3,067 deputy marshals and criminal investigators
- 1,374 administrative employees and detention enforcement officers
- Total employees: 4,535
- 94 districts; 212 sub-offices; three foreign offices

Fugitive Apprehension

- Arrested more than 35,500 federal fugitives, clearing 38,500 felony warrants
- Arrested more federal fugitives than all other law enforcement agencies combined
- Marshals Service-led fugitive task forces arrested more than 44,000 state/local fugitives, clearing 51,200 state/local felony warrants
- 182 *15 Most Wanted* fugitives have been captured since the inception of the program in 1983
- Extradited/deported 653 fugitives from 63 different countries

Justice Prisoner and Alien Transportation System (JPATS)

- More than 305,000 federal prisoner movements
- More than 181,000 movements by air
- More than 3,900 non-federal prisoner movements

Threat Evaluation

- Reviewed and processed 953 threats/inappropriate communications made to federal judicial employees

Judicial Security

- Senior inspectors, deputy marshals and contracted court security officers (CSOs) provide security at more than 400 facilities that house court operations
- Protect more than 2,000 federal judges
- Protect numerous other members of the federal judiciary, including U.S. attorneys, assistant U.S. attorneys and jurors
- Manage contracts for 4,500 CSOs

Asset Seizure and Forfeiture

- Currently managing approximately 15,845 assets with a value of more than \$1.2 billion
- Real property represents 26% of total value
- Cash and financial instruments represent 65% of total value
- Vehicles comprise 29% of inventory items
- Approximately \$3.86 billion has been shared with state/local agencies since fiscal 1985
- Fiscal 2005 equitable sharing payments were approximately \$272 million

Special Operations Group

- Specially trained tactical unit created in 1971
- Responds to emergencies anywhere in the United States or its territories
- Provides tactical support to district offices or as ordered by the U.S. attorney general
- Headquartered at Camp Beauregard, a Louisiana National Guard installation

Witness Security Program

- Total witnesses: 7,800
- Total participants: 17,700 (witnesses and family members)
- Testimonies of protected witnesses have resulted in an 89% conviction rate since 1971

Prisoner Custody

- Prisoners in daily custody: 53,446
- Prisoners received yearly: 168,781
- Prisoners produced yearly: 755,246
(excluding District of Columbia Superior Court)

Intergovernmental Agreements

- Intergovernmental Agreement jails: 1,300
- Average daily jail rate paid by the Marshals Service: \$61.96

Use of the Cooperative Agreement Program (CAP) by the Marshals Service

- Number of CAP agreements to date: 233
- Number of CAP beds: 13,432
- CAP federal court cities: 133
- Districts with CAP agreements: 86
- Total CAP funding to date: \$300 million
- Average construction cost of CAP bed: \$24,994

Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) Facilities

- BOP facilities used to house Marshals Service prisoners: 25
- Number of beds allocated: 12,269

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
