

TAKING THE WORST OF THE WORST OFF THE STREETS

Great Lakes Regional Fugitive Task Force (GLRFTF)

On February 21, 2007, Isaac Jones was arrested in Indianapolis, IN by members of GLRFTF. Authorities in Marion County (IN) wanted Jones for multiple counts of Attempted Murder and Carrying a Handgun Without a License. These charges relate to an incident in Indianapolis, which occurred on December 06, 2006. During this incident Jones allegedly used a handgun to shoot and severely injure a female victim. The victim suffered gunshot wounds to her back and arm. GLRFTF investigators, with critical assistance from the Technical Operations Group (TOG), developed information on Jones' location at a home in Indianapolis. Investigators responded to that site, made entry, and safely took Jones into custody as he hid in the home's basement. Following Jones' arrest, investigators executed a search warrant and seized two semi-automatic assault rifles, more than 200 rounds of ammunition for those weapons, a loaded 9mm handgun, a quantity of crack cocaine, nearly \$4,000 in US currency, a vehicle possibly used during the shooting incident, as well as assorted narcotics paraphernalia, to include scales and plastic bags.

Pacific Southwest Regional Fugitive Task Force (PSWRFTF)

On February 20, 2007, Kaleb Wiewandt was arrested in Irvine, CA by members of PSWRFTF, and officers from the Santa Ana and Anaheim, CA Police Departments. Authorities wanted Wiewandt for Bank Robbery after he allegedly engaged in a series of at least eight robberies throughout Orange and San Diego Counties (CA). Local media outlets dubbed Wiewandt the "Undergrad Bandit". Acting on a request to locate and apprehend Wiewandt, PSWRFTF investigators, with critical assistance from the Technical Operations Group (TOG), developed information that Wiewandt stayed in a series of hotel rooms during his alleged robbery spree. Investigators later identified Wiewandt's exact location at a hotel in Irvine, responded to that site, and established surveillance. Investigators later observed Wiewandt exit the hotel, moved in, and safely took him into custody as he attempted to enter a vehicle. During a search of Wiewandt incident to arrest, investigators discovered and seized a demand note from his pocket.

Southeast Regional Fugitive Task Force (SERFTF)


On February 16, 2007, Quenton Hart was arrested in McDonough, GA by members of SERFTF and inspectors from the Technical Operations Group (TOG). The Macon, GA Police Department (MPD) wanted Hart for Kidnapping, Aggravated Assault, Armed Robbery, and Extortion. These charges relate to an incident during which Hart and an associate allegedly kidnapped an individual after meeting him under the pretense of having tax documents prepared. Hart and his associate allegedly forced the victim into the trunk of a vehicle, drove him around, and later assaulted and robbed him. Hart and his associate then allegedly forced the victim to phone a family member and relay a ransom demand at gunpoint. The family member contacted MPD, which took a third individual into custody at the proposed drop site. Through further investigation, MPD identified Hart and his associates as the alleged kidnappers, and contacted SERFTF for assistance. SERFTF developed information that Hart fled to an apartment complex in the McDonough area, responded to that site, and safely took him into custody.

New York/New Jersey Regional Fugitive Task Force (NY/NJ RFTF)

On February 20, 2007, James Quisenberry was arrested in Union City, CA by members of NY/NJ RFTF and deputy US marshals (DUSMs) from the Northern District of California (N/CA). The New Jersey Department of Corrections wanted Quisenberry for Escape after he fled while incarcerated for Armed Robbery and Aggravated Assault with Intent to Kill. NY/NJ RFTF investigators developed information that Quisenberry and a female associate used aliases while renting a series of apartments throughout the United States, including in Kentucky, Texas, Nevada, and California. Investigators also developed information indicating that Quisenberry and his associate supported themselves using the profits derived from a series of theft and identity theft schemes. NY/NJ RFTF later identified Quisenberry's probable location in Union City, and with assistance from N/CA DUSMs, responded to that site and safely took him into custody as he hid in a bedroom closet. Quisenberry remains in custody pending extradition to California.

Gulf Coast Regional Fugitive Task Force (GCRFTF)

On February 23, 2007, Marvin Bernard Guyton was arrested in Jackson, MS by members of GCRFTF. The Hinds County (MS) Sheriff's Department wanted Guyton for Failure to Register as a Sex Offender, while the Mississippi Department of Corrections sought him for Violation of Probation. Authorities originally convicted Guyton for Sexual Abuse of a Child in 1997, while his probationary status related to a 2006 conviction for Failure to Register as a Sex Offender. GCRFTF investigators developed information indicating that Guyton would meet with a family member and established surveillance at that person's location. Investigators later observed Guyton approach, moved in, and safely took him into custody.

Capital Area Regional Fugitive Task Force (CARFTF)

On February 17, 2007, Garfield Redman was arrested in Washington, DC by members of CARFTF. The Montgomery County (MD) Sheriff's Office (MCSO) wanted Redman for a charge of Possession with Intent to Distribute cocaine, which dated to July 1999. After searching for Redman for more than seven years, MCSO contacted CARFTF in December 2006 for assistance in locating and apprehending him. CARFTF investigators developed information indicating that Redman remained in the metropolitan Washington area, and that he assumed a new identity. CARFTF coordinated closely with MCSO in identifying Redman's location, established surveillance at that site, and later observed him exit an apartment complex. Investigators moved in and safely took Redman into custody as he attempted to enter a vehicle. Incident to arrest, investigators seized three pounds of marijuana and a loaded .45 caliber handgun from Redman's person. A later search of the apartment Redman exited resulted in the seizure of an additional three pounds of marijuana. Redman, who faces additional narcotics and weapons charges, remains in custody pending extradition to Maryland.
