Southeast Regional Fugitive Task Force (SERFTF)


On April 13, 2007, Danny L. Henderson was arrested in Walthourville, GA by members of SERFTF and agents from the Multi-Agency Crack Enforcement Team (MACE), which covers Liberty (GA) and Long (GA) Counties. Authorities in Randolph County (AL) wanted Henderson for Murder after he allegedly killed a seventy-two year old man. The victim had been the primary witness against Henderson and his brother in an unrelated case involving theft. Henderson and his brother allegedly traveled to the victim's home in an effort to intimidate him into recanting his testimony. When the victim rebuffed Henderson and his brother, Henderson allegedly used his vehicle to hit the victim. The victim survived for a short time, but expired five days later as a direct result of his injuries. Investigators from the Gulf Coast Regional Fugitive Task Force developed information indicating that Henderson fled to Georgia, and contacted SERFTF for assistance. SERFTF investigators acted on this request, identified Henderson's location in Walthourville, and safely took him into custody. Henderson remains in custody pending extradition to Alabama. Henderson has a previous federal conviction for Assault on a Government Employee after he fired on a postal service employee with a shotgun.

Capital Area Regional Fugitive Task Force (CARFTF)

On April 11, 2007, David Edgardo Fuster, a Peruvian citizen, was arrested in Chelem, Yucatan, Mexico on a Provisional Arrest Warrant (PAW) with a view towards extradition by agents of the Agencia Federal de Investigacion (AFI). The arrest resulted from a joint fugitive investigation conducted by AFI, CARFTF, the Montgomery County (MD) Sheriff's Office (MCSO), the USMS District of Maryland, the USMS-Mexico Foreign Field Office (MFFO), and the Technical Operations Group (TOG). Issued in the Republic of Mexico on April 03, 2007, the PAW related to an outstanding MCSO warrant charging Fuster with Failure to Appear to face sentencing for a 2003 conviction for Rape of a Minor, Assault, Child Abuse, and sex offenses. These convictions relate to Fuster's use of nitrous-oxide gas during a dental procedure to pacify and then sexually assault a teenage female. CARFTF investigators developed information indicating that Fuster fled to Mexico, assumed a false identity, and possibly began practicing dentistry again. Following Fuster's arrest, AFI transported him to Mexico City, Mexico where he will face further extradition proceedings. Fuster faces the possibility of fifty-five years imprisonment.

New York/New Jersey Regional Fugitive Task Force (NY/NJ RFTF)

On April 12, 2007, Tammi Rand was arrested in Camden, NJ by members of NY/NJ RFTF. The Camden City, NJ Police Department wanted Rand for Robbery, Aggravated Assault, and for Possession of a Handgun. These charges relate to a two-week crime spree Rand allegedly engaged in, during which she committed seven armed robberies of convenience stores using a handgun. Following these incidents, Rand allegedly fled with approximately \$800 in US currency. NY/NJ RFTF investigators developed information identifying Rand's location at a home in Camden, responded to that site, and safely took her into custody. Investigators transported Rand to the Camden City Police Department, where she provided detectives with a full, taped confession to her role in all seven incidents.

Gulf Coast Regional Fugitive Task Force (GCRFTF)

On April 11, 2007, Kent Stewart, a registered sex offender, was arrested in Ozark, AL by members of GCRFTF and officers from the Ozark Police Department (OPD). Authorities in Ozark wanted Stewart for Kidnapping and Rape of a Minor after he allegedly abducted a ten year old girl from a playground on April 10, 2007, and then sexually assaulted her. After authorities identified Stewart as a suspect, GCRFTF established covert surveillance outside his probable location. Investigators later observed a male subject matching Stewart's description enter the target residence, moved in, and safely took Stewart into custody as he hid in the attic. Stewart has a previous conviction for Rape, which involved the sexual assault of an elderly woman. If convicted, Stewart faces life imprisonment with no possibility of parole.



Great Lakes Regional Fugitive Task Force (GLRFTF)

On April 15, 2007, Brandon Hunter, a documented member of the *Vice Lords* gang, was arrested in Gary, IN by members of GLRFTF. Authorities in Gary wanted Hunter for Murder and Attempted Murder after he allegedly shot three people, killing one. Authorities believe that Hunter, who suffers from a birth defect that caused a severe malformation of his arms, allegedly shot the victims in the belief that they stared at him while parked at a local gas station. At the time of the shooting, Hunter had been released on bond from narcotics-related charges. GLRFTF investigators received a description on Hunter's vehicle, located it outside a home in Gary, and safely took Hunter into custody at that location.

Pacific Southwest Regional Fugitive Task Force (PSWRFTF)

On April 09, 2007, Tyrone Darcell Garret, a documented member of the *107th Street Underground Bloods* gang, was arrested in Las Vegas, NV by deputy US marshals (DUSMs) from the District of Nevada Fugitive Investigative Strike Team (FIST), who acted on information provided by PSWRFTF investigators. The Los Angeles County (CA) Sheriff's Department (LASD) wanted Garret, a fugitive for nearly two years, for Felon in Possession of a Firearm, as well as for narcotics charges; both charges carried gang enhancements. On April 04, 2007, LASD requested PSWRFTF assistance in locating and apprehending Garret. PSWRFTF investigators developed information indicating that Garret fled to a Las Vegas home along with a female companion. PSWRFTF forwarded this information to FIST, which established surveillance outside that location. FIST units determined that narcotics activities took place inside the target home and obtained and executed a search warrant there. As investigators entered the home, Garret attempted to flee, but FIST DUSMs quickly subdued and arrested him. Investigators later seized \$26,400 in US currency as well as 3.6 kilograms of marijuana. The target home also housed a sophisticated marijuana grow facility. Garret remains in custody pending extradition to California.
