TAKING THE WORST OF THE WORST OFF THE STREETS

Capital Area Regional Fugitive Task Force (CARFTF)

On May 30, 2007, Davon Jackson was arrested in Seat Pleasant, MD by members of CARFTF. The Prince George's County (MD) Sheriff's Department wanted Jackson for Attempted Murder of a Police Officer following an incident on May 28, 2007. On that date, officers from the Riverdale Park, MD Police Department responded to reports of a vehicle theft in progress. As officers arrived on scene, Jackson allegedly attempted to strike an officer using the stolen vehicle. Officers fired on Jackson, but he evaded immediate capture. CARFTF investigators developed information on Jackson's location in Seat Pleasant, responded to that site, and safely took him into custody following surveillance. Incident to Jackson's arrest, investigators discovered that he received a gunshot wound to the arm. CARFTF units transported Jackson to the hospital, where he received treatment for non-life threatening injuries. Authorities previously sought Jackson for Auto Theft.

Southeast Regional Fugitive Task Force (SERFTF)

On May 31, 2007, Eduardo Vega was arrested in Cobb County (GA) by members of SERFTF, deputies from the Cobb County Sheriff's Office, and officers from the Atlanta, GA and Fulton County (GA) Police Departments. Authorities in Fulton County wanted Vega for charges relating to a carjacking and shooting that took place on May 31, 2007. During this incident, Vega allegedly carjacked a woman by pointing a firearm at her infant's head and then ordering her from her vehicle. A plain clothes Atlanta Police Department (APD) officer observed the act in progress and approached Vega along with vehicle units from the Fulton County Police Department (FCPD). As the APD officer approached, Vega allegedly began to fire on him and then rammed one of the FCPD units before fleeing into a nearby wooded area. Later that same day, SERFTF investigators developed information indicating that Vega fled to the Cobb County area, established surveillance there, and later observed him exit a residence in the company of a female subject. Investigators followed the pair to a local gas station where they took Vega safely into custody. Authorities in California also sought Vega for narcotics-related charges and Parole Violation, while officials in Cobb County wanted him for Battery. Vega has an extensive criminal history that includes six arrests for Armed Robbery.

Pacific Southwest Regional Fugitive Task Force (PSWRFTF)

On May 29, 2007, James D. Sullivan was arrested in Culver City, CA by members of PSWRFTF, agents from the US Secret Service, and investigators from the Los Angeles County (CA) District Attorney's Office. The USMS Northern Ohio Violent Fugitive Task Force (NOVFTF) sought Sullivan for Failure to Register as a Sex Offender, Parole Violation, and Escape. Sullivan's requirement to register related to a 1982 conviction for Gross Sexual Imposition, for which he served twenty-two years in prison. In that case, Sullivan assaulted an eleven year old female. NOVFTF investigators developed information indicating that Sullivan fled to California, and contacted PSWRFTF for assistance in locating and apprehending him. PSWRFTF, with critical assistance from the Technical Operations Group (TOG), identified Sullivan's location in Culver City. Investigators established surveillance at Sullivan's location, and later observed him drive by in a vehicle. Investigators pursued Sullivan, initiated a traffic stop, and safely took him into custody. Sullivan has a lengthy criminal history of Gross Sexual Imposition, Aggravated Burglary, and sex-related Criminal Trespass; and currently remains in custody pending further extradition proceedings.

Great Lakes Regional Fugitive Task Force (GLRFTF)

On May 31, 2007, Alexander Garcia was arrested in Milwaukee, WI by members of GLRFTF and the Technical Operations Group (TOG). The Waterbury, CT Police Department wanted Garcia for Aggravated Assault with a Firearm after he allegedly fired a handgun numerous times, striking two individuals multiple times each. Deputy US marshals from the District of Connecticut developed information indicating that Garcia fled to the Milwaukee-area, and contacted GLRFTF for assistance in locating and apprehending him. GLRFTF and TOG investigators identified Garcia's location, responded to that site, and safely took him into custody following surveillance.

New York/New Jersey Regional Fugitive Task Force (NY/NJ RFTF)

On June 02, 2007, Gregory Kellum, aged seventeen, and a juvenile male aged fourteen were arrested in Camden, NJ and Bridgeton, NJ by members of NY/NJ RFTF. The Camden Police Department and Camden County (NJ) Prosecutor's Office wanted both Kellum and the juvenile for Criminal Homicide after they allegedly shot and killed a person on May 30, 2007. During this incident, Kellum, who is affiliated with the **Bloods** gang, and the juvenile allegedly took turns using the same handgun to repeatedly shoot a person during an apparent gang-initiation ritual. Authorities recovered more than ten .22 caliber shell-casings from the scene of the shooting. NY/NJ RFTF investigators developed information on both Kellum and the juvenile's locations, responded to those sites, and safely took both into custody. Authorities will prosecute Kellum as an adult offender.

Gulf Coast Regional Fugitive Task Force (GCRFTF)

On May 31, 2007, Quintarus Rhodes was arrested in Greenville, MS by members of GCRFTF, deputy US marshals (DUSMs) from the Northern District of Mississippi, and officers from the Greenville Police Department. The Fayetteville, NC Police Department wanted Rhodes for Murder and Aggravated Assault after he allegedly fired shots into a crowd on April 21, 2007, killing one and injuring three others. DUSMs from the Eastern District of North Carolina developed information indicating that Rhodes fled to Greenville and contacted GCRFTF for assistance in locating and apprehending him. Investigators acted on this request, identified Rhodes' location, and safely took him into custody there following surveillance.
