Eric E. Robertson was appointed by President George W. Bush on February 14, 2002, to the position of United States Marshal for the Western District of Washington. As the regional administrator for the U.S. Marshals Service, he is responsible for leading the district's employees in meeting the goals and objectives of the agency. The U.S. Marshals Service is responsible for the security of the federal judiciary and the courthouses, transportation and production of prisoners, apprehension of federal fugitives, execution of civil and criminal process, the asset seizure program, and other duties as directed by the Attorney General. He is a member of the Washington Anti-Terrorism Advisory Committee

Prior to joining the U.S. Marshals Service, Marshal Robertson was a captain with the Washington State Patrol, where he had served since 1983. At the State Patrol, he served in several positions including the director of the Office of Government and Media Relations where he worked with the media and was spokesman for the Chief of the Washington State Patrol, and served as the Chief's liaison to the Washington State Legislature. He has also served as commander of the Office of Professional Standards, which includes the department's Internal Affairs and Audit Sections. He served as a trooper in several communities in Washington, including Enumclaw, South King County, and Wenatchee. He was also appointed as a detective assigned to Internal Affairs and traffic investigations.

Marshal Robertson was elected to the Washington State House of Representatives in 1994, representing the 31<sup>st</sup> District. During his two terms, he served on the Transportation Policy and Budget, Rules, Legislative Transportation Committee, Criminal Justice and Corrections, and Law and Justice Committees. When he left the legislature in 1998, he was the House Majority Caucus Chairman.

He is a graduate of White River High School in Buckley, attended Green River Community College in Auburn, and is a 1985 graduate of the Washington State Patrol Academy in Shelton. He has attended University of Virginia and is currently attending City University. In December 1999, he graduated from the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia.

Marshal Robertson is a fourth-generation resident of Buckley, Washington. He and his wife, Carolyn, are the parents of four children.
