NYC robbery suspect attempts to flee U.S. Marshals in East Granby

EAST GRANBY, Conn. – The U.S. Marshals Violent Fugitive Task Force Dec. 20 arrested a man wanted in connection with three separate home invasion robberies in New York City that occurred between October and November.

Anthony Mack, 25, was taken into custody at approximately 11 a.m. on Talcott Range Drive in East Granby. As law enforcement personnel approached the front of the residence, Mack fled from the rear of the home where he was taken into custody in the back yard without further incident.

During one of the home invasions, Mack is suspected of forcing entry into a south Bronx residence where at knife point he robbed and threatened to stab the home owner. Mack also has two felony warrants for criminal contempt out of New York.

U.S. Marshals from Connecticut were assisted by the New York City Police Department, Connecticut State Police and the East Granby Constable's Office. Mack was turned over to the Connecticut State Police where he will be charged as a fugitive of justice and will be held pending extradition to New York.

The Violent Fugitive Task Force is a team of law enforcement officers led by U.S. Marshals from the District of Connecticut. The task force's objective is to seek out and arrest violent fugitives and sexual predators. Membership agencies include; Hartford, New Haven, Hamden, West Haven, Bridgeport, Norwalk, and Waterbury Police Departments as well as CT Parole.
