JUDICIAL SECURITY

10.7 ACTIVE SHOOTER/ACTIVE THREAT

- **A. Proponent:** Judicial Security Division (JSD).
- **B.** Purpose: To ensure the safety of United States Marshals Service (USMS) personnel, this policy defines the USMS Active Shooter/Active Threat (ASAT) plan and establishes the duties and responsibilities for the formulation and implementation of the plan.
- **C. Authority:** The Director's authority to direct and supervise all activities of the USMS is derived from 28 U.S.C. § 561(g) and 28 C.F.R. § 0.111. 28 U.S.C. § 566 (e)(1)(A) establishes the USMS authority to provide personal protection to federal jurists, court officers, witnesses, and other threatened persons in the interests of justice where criminal intimidation impedes on the judicial process or any other official proceeding.
